

KASEY R. JACOBS was placed with the Puerto Rico Coastal Zone Management Program in the Department of Natural and Environmental Resources as a NOAA Coastal Management Fellow. During this two year fellowship, Kasey is coordinating the Puerto Rico Coastal Adaptation Project. The project has convened over 130 scientists, researchers, planners, architects, and practitioners since November 2010, called The Puerto Rico Climate Change Council (PRCCC). The PRCCC is conducting Puerto Rico's first climate change vulnerability assessment and recommending adaptation strategies. Originally from Long Island, New York, Kasey completed her Bachelor of Science in Environmental Science-Marine Biology from Southampton College. After university, Kasey served as Long Island and Connecticut Program Coordinator for Citizens Campaign for the Environment and later graduated with a master's degree (MESc) from the Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies. Her graduate work included serving as a Climate Change Advisor for the Permanent Mission of Belize to the United Nations as well as Head of Delegation for Yale University to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change's (UNFCCC) Council of the Parties 15 in Copenhagen, Denmark. For her master's thesis Kasey conducted field research on climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction in West Sumatra, Indonesia and interned for Mercy Corps Indonesia.
